More Golden Moments

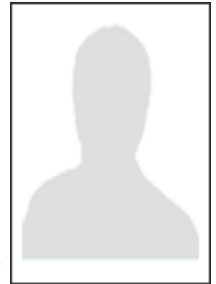
In the second installment of Good Rotary Moments, the new feature created by new president **Steve Leonetti**, picked up some steam.

emotional abuse of children and young people with whom they come into contact."

To implement this policy, anyone who has one-on-one contact with a young person in a Rotary program (mentors of our scholarship students, host parents of our exchange students, advisers to our Interact Clubs, or just someone who takes one of the students to a Giants' game) must go through a background check.

For now, we are applying the Four-Way Test. If you know you have this kind of responsibility, you will voluntarily fill out the form and have it done. Lisa Nouchi is our club's point person on background checks done by the district. I did it as the host parent for the incoming student this year. I hope all of you who have this responsibility will do it this year.

Let's keep our children safe.
